At 1213 hours vic BS512720 Co D 1st Plat engaged 1 VC with weapon evading resulting in 1 VC KIA by body count. At 1219 hours Co D 3d Plat engaged 1 VC with web gear vic BS512720 resulting in 1 VC CIA/WIA. In the area of the 4 well camouflaged huts Co D found 123 individual and crew-served weapons, 3600 Chicon and homemade hand grenades, 9 B40 rockets, 82mm ammo, misc explosives, misc medical supplies, 3 tons of polished rice and misc clothing and documents. Recon returned to OP George as OP security at 0730 hrs.
