Operations continued throughout the 4-3 Inf AO with light enemy contact during the reporting period.

1. Co A(-) occupied & began dismantling bunkers on LZ SUE. One platoon of Co A conducted GOLDEN FLEECE operations in the Tra Bong River valley.

#### SIGNIFICANT EVENTS:

At 071851H May, vic BS555898, 2d platoon Co A sustained 1 US KHA and 4 US WHA, resulting from the detonation of an unknown type mine.

2. Co B occupied LZs DOTTIE & UPTIGHT and conducted local patrols & amb.

#### SIGNIFICANT EVENTS:

Co B, while on LZ DOTTIE, received 18-20 rounds of 82mm mortar fire, resulting in 4 US WHA & 1 VN interpreter WHA. Incident occurred at 050137 May.

3. Co C conducted local security operations on LZ BUFF and assisted in construction of that FSB.

4. Co D conducted intensified search operations along the eastern portion of the MUSCATINE AO.

#### SIGNIFICANT EVENTS:

a. At 060201H May 68, vic BS722825, received 1 mortar round, resulting in 3 US WHA.

b. At 070722H May, Co D conducted a CA into LZs BS 733892, 718899, & 722889. All LZs were cold.

c. At 081917 May, vic BS720880, Co D received 4-5 mortar rounds and AW fire resulting in 1 US KHA and 2 US WHA. Fire was returned, resulting in 2 VC KIA.

d. At 101914 May, vic BS705885, received large amount of SA fire & 3-4 rounds mortar fire. Fire was returned, resulting in 1 VC KIA.

5. Recon Platoon cleared path through minefield around OP GEORGE during this reporting period.
