TIME: 180120 Received telephone call from CPT Brown (S-4) in the 4-3 Chu Lai trains area. He gave the following report:

At approximately 172200 hrs CPT Brown was contacted by the 198th Military Police with the first details of an incident which is described as follows:

At approximately 171830 hrs 5 US personnel from the 4-3 departed the 4-3 trains area in a 1/4 tn vehicle (C-3). These 5 individuals were not authorized to leave the trains area, nor were they authorized use of any vehicle. The 5 individuals were named as follows:

SP4 Jones (HHC)
SP4 Jeffers (B Co)
SP4 Moody (C Co)
PFC Holmes (B Co)
PFC Smith (C Co)

The 5 above named individuals drove into a village which is located somewhere between Chu Lai and Hill 69 which is the 1-46 firebase. The jeep was parked outside of a laundry shop and the 5 individuals went inside. While they were inside the shop an unknown number of local Vietnamese villagers got into the jeep and drove it a short distance down the street, whereupon it struck a Vietnamese boy and then overturned. The Vietnamese boy had both of his legs severed in the accident.

A large crowd of local villagers and some PF troops began to gather in the vicinity of the accident. The 5 individuals who had been in the shop went to the scene of the accident to investigate. At or about this same time another 4-3 1/4tn vehicle (B-3) arrived at the scene of the accident with SP4 Veldmeizen (HHC) and SP4 Joyce (HHC). (CPT Brown stated that these two individuals were not authorized to depart the 4-3 trains area or to use a 1/4 tn vehicle.) Veldmeizen and Joyce attempted to retrieve the vehicle and the 5 individuals from 4-3 from the scene of the accident, however the crowd of villagers had grown in size and appeared to be outraged and would not allow the vehicle to be moved. Veldmeizen and Joyce were able to locate Moody, Holmes, and Smith in the crowd and move back to their own vehicle, but they were unable to locate Jones and Jeffers. The 5 individuals left the village and returned to the An Ton bridge security post where they called for the M.P.'s.

The M.P.'s arrived at the bridge about one hour later and accompanied the 5 individuals from 4-3 back into the village. The M.P.'s were able to take custody of and remove the accident vehicle, but SP4 Jones and SP4 Jeffers could not be found. (Details regarding what happened to the Vietnamese boy whose legs were severed were not available at the time of this report.) Moody, Holmes, Smith, Veldmeizen, and Joyce were returned to 4-3 trains area in Chu Lai and the accident vehicle is being held by the 198th Inf Bde M.P.'s. SP4 Jones and SP4 Jeffers are still missing.

CPT Brown stated that all US units in the area had been notified of the incident to include the security platoon located on the An Ton bridge, the Lei Thien District Advisor Detachment, the 1st Bn 46th Inf located at Hill 69, and the Americal Military Police.

It is unknown at this time how the two vehicles from 4-3 were able to depart the Chu Lai Base, since the main gate is closed to all outgoing vehicular traffic at 1800 hrs daily.
